First and foremost, I sincerely hope you are all safe and well as we approach the end of the fifth week of school closure. I know I speak on behalf of all the staff when I say we all miss the children terribly and cannot wait for the return of some sort of normality. There has been a lot of unhelpful speculation in the media recently with regard to when schools might open. Schools receive daily updates from the Department for Education which is taken from the daily government briefings and as soon as we have any clear direction we will of course communicate information to you. As a school, we would love nothing more than to re-open at the earliest possible point but we can only do so when the national evidence base proves that this will be safe for everyone.

We have heard lots of positive stories about how the children are getting on, and we have enjoyed seeing some of the wonderful artwork and learning they've been doing at home.
