It was wonderful to see so many of you attending parents evening on Wednesday. I wanted to say a particular well done to those pupils in year 3 who took part in our first child-led parents evening. Hearing them talk so confidently, proudly and articulately about their learning was heartwarming and we may well arrange a school-wide child-led parents evening for the summer term!

A number of pupils from years 3-6 have recently been learning poems by heart. Yesterday, some of these pupils took part in a Trust-wide poetry competition to recite their poems in front of an audience. Mrs Boothroyd and Mrs Townson, who accompanied the children, said they were absolutely exceptional. I also received an email from Yvonne Brown, our CEO, expressing just how impressed she was:
