

Start of day arrangements

Years 1-6

Our 8.35am-8.50am arrival slot will continue in September as we know that this enables children to arrive in school calmly and confidently, ready to get on with their learning straight away. Pupils in Years 1-6 will enter via the main gate between 8.35am-8.50am.

Early Years and Butterfly Class

Pupils (and parents) of Reception, Nursery, Pre-School and Butterfly Class will enter via the small gate between 8.35am-8.50am. Please follow the path round to Early Years or the Butterfly Room and drop your child off at their classroom. If you are new to school please don't panic — Early Years staff will be present at the gate and in the Early Years outdoor area to help!

Breakfast Club

Breakfast club is open from 7.45am-8.15am and is free of charge for all pupils. Please enter the school grounds via the main gate, turn right and drop children off at the dining room door at the rear of school.

End of day arrangements

Gates will open at 3.20pm. The school day finishes at 3.20pm: please expect to collect your child from 3.20pm and not before.

<u>Early Years and Butterfly Class:</u> Parents will enter school via the small gate, follow the path round to the Early Years outdoor area and collect their children from classrooms.

Year 1: Children will be collected from the cloakroom door to the right of the climbing frame.

<u>Year 2 and Butterfly Class:</u> Year 2 children will be collected from the Year 2 external classroom door —please follow the path round to the rear of school behind Early Years. Butterfly Class pupils will be collected from their external door.

Years 3 to 6: Children will be collected from their class line in the Key Stage 2 playground.

Pupils in years 5 and 6 may walk home independently providing we have a signed permission form. These letters will be sent out at the beginning of the week.

Please note that additional staff will be present at the start and end of the school day to help direct parents and carers.

Parking

Please park carefully and considerately on Bracken Bank Crescent and avoid parking on the pavement. The two disabled parking spaces at the front of school are for the use of parents and carers of pupils with disabilities (or adults with disabilities) only. Thank you for your understanding.

Please can I ask parents and carers to NOT collect your child early from the school office unless in exceptional circumstances. Whilst I do appreciate that you may have a good reason to do this, it puts a huge strain on our staff. We are unable to let children walk to the office on their own and so we have to release a member of staff to accompany the child. As all staff are busy teaching or supporting children at this time, it does mean that this is interrupted, as well as the child's learning and education.

School Uniform

In order to maintain a strong sense of identity and belonging within our school, the school uniform consists of:

- Navy blue sweatshirt/cardigan with logo
- Royal blue polo shirt
- Grey tailored trousers no jeans or leggings
- Grey skirt or pinafore (modest length)
- Black, flat, sensible, safe 'school' shoes (not canvas or 'ballet' style) **or** plain black trainers
- Plain black, grey or white tights, knee or ankle socks

In warmer weather:

- Grey or black tailored shorts (modest length) no cycling shorts.
- Blue gingham dresses
- Cap or sunhat to protect from the sun

PE Kit

- White polo shirt
- Plain navy blue shorts or plain navy blue joggers
- Trainers for outdoor PE

All the items above (with the exception of items displaying the school logo) are readily available from most supermarkets or school uniform providers on the high street. If parents and carers find it difficult to obtain any item, please contact school. Our uniform has been kept simple and cost effective to avoid unnecessary expense. We expect all pupils to follow the dress code as written above.

If parents are unsure about any items of school uniform, they should contact the school for clarification.

Jewellery

Items of jewellery are not permitted at school. Should a pupil have pierced ears, only **plain studs** should only be worn and in order to comply with health and safety regulations, must be covered with a plaster during all PE activities. Sleepers, diamante and 'fashion' earrings are **not** permitted. Other body piercings are not allowed.

Please note that the school will be unable to take any responsibility for any jewellery that is lost, including watches. Watches may be worn to school, however, they must be removed and collected by the class teacher before any PE lessons.

Make-Up

No make-up, nail varnish or permanent or temporary tattoos are to be worn.

Hair

We recommend that hair should be neat and tidy and worn with no extremes of style or colour. Tramlines, mohicans, large spikes, shaved sides with longer middle strip, tails etc are not permitted. Long hair should be tied back for safety when possible and at all times for PE lessons. Should the Headteacher deem that the hairstyle does not fit in with our policy and ethos, parents will be contacted to discuss this.
